## **ATHLETES OF THE WEEK FOR JANUARY 23, 2012**

**UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION** Athlete of the Week selections are drawn from nominees submitted by member institution coaches and sports information directors. **UAA Athletes of the Week** are selected in each sport in which the **UAA** sponsors competition. They are selected on the basis of their individual performances and contributions to team efforts during the past week in both Association and non-Association competition.

### **Women's Basketball**

#### **Hannah Lilly — Emory University — Mercer Island, WA (Mercer Island)**

Hannah Lilly averaged 25.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 5.0 steals in helping Emory University to home victories over Carnegie Mellon University and Case Western Reserve University. Lilly totaled a game-high 26 points, hitting 10 of 17 from the field including 6 of 11 from three-point range, in a 59-55 win over Carnegie Mellon. She also contributed four rebounds and a team-high tying five steals. The sophomore scored a game-high 24 points in a 68-56 victory over Case on Sunday to mark her fourth-straight tally of 20 or more points. She converted 8 of 16 from the field, knocked down all six of her free throws, and posted another team-high five steals to help the Eagles capture their fourth straight contest and advance to 13-3. In the two games, Lilly shot 54.5 percent (18 of 33) from the floor including 42.1 percent (8 of 19) from beyond the arc.

### **Men's Basketball**

#### **Matt Johnson — University of Chicago — Ann Arbor, MI (Pioneer)**

Senior Matt Johnson of the University of Chicago scored 68 points in two games, including a school record-tying 44 points against Brandeis University. On the weekend, he shot 60.7 percent from the field, 52.6 percent from three-point range (10 of 19), and 87.5 percent from the foul line. In a 97-89 overtime loss to Brandeis, Johnson sunk 13 of 20 from the field, 10 of 12 from the charity stripe, and 8 of 12 from beyond the arc. His 44-point performance was just three points shy of tying a UAA record for the most points scored in a single game.

#### **Kyle Stockmal — NYU — Watertown, MA (Watertown)**

Junior Kyle Stockmal of NYU guided the Violets to their first sweep of the UAA Midwest trip by averaging 25.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, and three assists per game while shooting a scorching 83.3 percent (15 of 18) from the floor and an astonishing 91.7 percent (11 of 12) from three-point range. In an 81-71 victory over University of Chicago, Stockmal poured in a career-high 26 points, shooting 8 of 10 from the field and 7 of 8 from three-point range. His seven threes were one shy of the school record and registered him as the fourth player in school history to hit seven or more treys in a game. The guard led NYU to its second win ever at Washington University on Sunday. He tallied 24 points and four assists on 7 of 8 shooting and hit 4 of 4 from beyond the arc in the 89-75 victory.

### **Women's Fencing**

#### **Meg Dadourian — NYU — South Pasadena, CA (South Pasadena)**

Junior Meg Dadourian of NYU posted a 6-6 record in epee against some of the toughest teams in the nation on Sunday, as NYU hosted third-ranked University of Notre Dame, fifth-ranked St. John's University, sixth-ranked Ohio State University, Northwestern University, Yale University, and Wayne State University. Dadourian finished a perfect 3-0 against Wayne State, and 2-1 versus Yale to help the Violets to a 14-13 victory. Her sixth win came against third-ranked Notre Dame, a 1-1 match.

### ***Men's Fencing***

#### **Andrew Ark — NYU — Basking Ridge, NJ (Ridge)**

NYU freshman foilist Andrew Ark finished 11-5 against some of the top competitors in the nation on Sunday as the Violets hosted fourth-ranked University of Notre Dame, fifth-ranked Ohio State University, sixth-ranked St. John's University, 10<sup>th</sup>-ranked Yale University, University of North Carolina, and Wayne State University. Ark posted a perfect 3-0 record against St. John's, as well as a perfect 2-0 mark versus Yale. He finished 2-1 against Ohio State and Wayne State, and also picked up one win apiece against Notre Dame and UNC.

### ***Women's Swimming and Diving***

#### **Megan Beach — Emory University — Redwood City, CA (Sequoia)**

Megan Beach of Emory University recorded an NCAA Division III provisional time and two first-place finishes during the top-ranked Eagles' dual meet victory over Savannah College of Art & Design (SCAD) on Saturday. Beach won the 200-yard breaststroke with a provisional time of 2:24.04. She also claimed an individual victory in the 1,000-yard freestyle with a 10:33.08 finish. The freshman capped off her day with a fourth-place finish in the 100-yard freestyle, touching the wall in 55.08 seconds. Beach's performance helped the team to a 138-61 win over SCAD.

#### **Kelly Dietz — NYU — Clifton, VA (Thomas Jefferson HS for Science and Technology)**

Kelly Dietz of NYU continued her remarkable campaign with an impressive performance at the Violets' three-team invitational on Friday. The senior recorded a victory and surpassed the NCAA Division III qualifying standard with a score of 281.50 points in the one-meter dive. Dietz also placed second in the three-meter dive with a qualifying score of 289.80. Her performance helped NYU finish second with 649 points behind Division I Old Dominion University (792) and above Montclair State University (416).

### ***Men's Swimming and Diving***

#### **Anton Razanav — Carnegie Mellon University — San Diego, CA (Westview)**

Freshman Anton Razanav of Carnegie Mellon University helped lead the Tartans to a 2-0 dual record this past weekend with a 176-117 win against SUNY Geneseo and a 198-95 victory over Westminster College (PA). Razanav won the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 54.85 took first in the 200-yard backstroke with a 1:56.99 finish.

#### **Austen Blease — NYU — San Jose, CA (St. Francis)**

NYU freshman Austen Blease continued his remarkable rookie campaign with two more wins in the Violets' three-team invitational meet on Friday. He recorded an NCAA Division III qualifying score and captured the one-meter dive with a mark of 298.95. Blease was also victorious on the three-meter board surpassing the qualifying mark with a personal-best score of 334.50 points. He helped NYU place second in the three-team invitational against Division I Old Dominion University and Division III Montclair State University.

### ***Women's Indoor Track & Field***

#### **Kim Farrington — Brandeis University — Shirley, MA (Ayer)**

Kim Farrington of Brandeis University won the triple jump at the 2012 Greater Boston Track Club Invitational. The junior registered a leap of 10.69 meters, 0.35 meters better than the next collegiate competitor from Division I Bryant University and 0.04 ahead of the unattached second-place jumper.

#### **Erica Jackey — Washington University — Newark, DE (Archmere Academy)**

Senior Erica Jackey led Washington University to a team victory at the Illinois Wesleyan Triangular on Saturday. Jackey set a school record in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:14.14 to finish second in the event. Her time in the event places her third on the Division III indoor qualifying list. She also finished first in the mile at the meet with a time of 5:06.40, ranking fifth in Division III to date.

### ***Men's Indoor Track and Field***

#### **Chris Brown — Brandeis University — North Chelmsford, MA (Chelmsford)**

Brandeis University senior Chris Brown finished third in the open mile run at the 2012 Greater Boston Track Club Invitational with a time of 4:08.45. His time tops the UAA performance list, places him second on the Division III indoor qualifying list, and was more than three seconds faster than the only other runner in the event from Division I Providence College.

#### **Justin Pieper — Washington University — Glencoe, MO (Gateway Academy)**

Justin Pieper of Washington University won the high jump at the Illinois Wesleyan Triangular with a season-best clearance of 2.00 meters. The senior helped the Bears to a team victory at the triangular. Pieper's leap ties for eighth place on the Division III indoor qualifying list.

### ***Wrestling***

#### **Mario Palmisano — University of Chicago — Willoughby Hills, OH (East Willoughby)**

University of Chicago freshman Mario Palmisano won both of his bouts in the 197-pound weight class by fall in dual meet competition. He won in 6:52 against his opponent from Augustana College before pinning his St. Olaf College rival in 4:05.

### ***Men's Tennis***

#### **Troy Brinker — University of Chicago — Granger, IN (Penn)**

Senior Troy Brinker helped the University of Chicago defeat Division I University of Illinois-Chicago 5-2 in the season-opener Saturday night. Brinker won in straight sets 6-3, 6-4 at first singles and posted an 8-5 decision at first doubles with teammate Jan Stefanski.
