Women's Basketball

Misha Jackson — Emory University — Atlanta, GA (St. Pius X)

Junior Misha Jackson of Emory University helped the Eagles to three victories last week averaging 19.6 points, 6.6 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game. She topped the club in scoring in all three contests, shooting 64.2 percent (27-for-42) from the field, highlighted by an 11-for-16 effort en route to a career-high 25 points in an 80-58 decision over LaGrange College on Wednesday. Jackson also grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds in that contest for her second double-double of the season. In Sunday's 72-59 win over Birmingham-Southern College she scored a game-high 20 points, knocking down 10 of 15 from the field. Jackson opened the week tallying a team-best 14 points, hitting 6-for-11 from the floor in just 19 minutes of action in an 87-43 victory over Covenant College.

Men's Basketball

Jake Davis — Emory University — Cincinnati, OH (Seven Hills School)

Jake Davis of Emory University averaged a team-high 23.0 points and seven rebounds to help the 13th-ranked Eagles remain undefeated with three wins last week. Davis hit an impressive 64.3 percent (27-for-42) from the floor for the week and led the team in scoring in two of the three victories. He tallied a team-leading 21 points and grabbed six rebounds, hitting 9-for-14 from the floor in just 20 minutes of action in a 95-63 win at Berry College on Tuesday. On Saturday the sophomore led the team with a career-high 33 points and 10 rebounds in a 107-89 triumph over LaGrange College. He sank 14 for 18 from the floor, tying the fifth-highest game total in school history. Davis' 33-point achievement was the highest individual scoring mark by an Eagle under head coach Jason Zimmerman. He closed out the week with a 15-point performance in a 75-61 victory over Maryville College.

Wrestling

Matt DiGiovanni — NYU — Cranford, NJ (Cranford)

NYU freshman Matt DiGiovanni won both of his bouts as the Violets split their matches against Hunter College and Yeshiva University on Tuesday. During a 45-6 win over Yeshiva, DiGiovanni pinned his 149-pound opponent in just 47 seconds. He grinded out a 4-3 decision against a tough opponent in a 29-13 team loss to Hunter. DiGiovanni improves to 3-3 on the season, and NYU moves to 2-3 in dual meets.
